MOTION FOR PATERNITY TESTING

Comes Now, JAMES ALLEN, Respondent in the above numbered and styled suit and files this his motion for paternity testing and in support thereof shows this court the following.

1. Respondent was served with court papers alleging that he is the biological father of the child Magnus Vincent Petersen on October 17, 2001.
2. Respondent is not certain that he is the biological father of the child in question.
3. Respondent therefore, requests the court to order the parties to submit to paternity testing, prior to the final trial and that each party be ordered to pay one-half of the costs of the tests. Respondent further prays that in the event that he be found not to be the father of the child, that Petitioner be ordered to reimburse the costs he paid for such paternity testing.

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ORDER FOR PATERNITY TESTS

On December 14, 2001, the court heard James Allen's Motion for Paternity tests in this case.

Movant James Allen appeared in person and by attorney of record Mary E. Everson and announced ready.

Respondent Veronica Petersen, although duly notified, did not appear and wholly made default.

The Court, having considered the pleadings, and having heard the evidence and argument of counsel, finds that all legal prerequisites have been satisfied in bring this suit and that this Court has properly exercised jurisdiction over the parties and subject matter of this cause. The court further finds that no other court has continuing jurisdiction over the parties and subject matter herein.

The Court finds that Respondent gave birth to Magnus Vincent Petersen, a male child born on May 29, 2001 in Dallas, TX. Movant James Allen claims Magnus Petersen is not his biological child because Respondent was cohabiting with another man at the time of the child's conception. The Court further finds that Movant has requested that the parties and child submit to paternity testing in order to determine whether he is the biological father of the child in question.
